Mount Carmel Ministries

What is Mount Carmel's Mission?

Mount Carmel is a place of rest, renewal and recreation where people experience Jesus. God's Word, Christian Community, Hospitality and the Joy of Jesus are the foundation upon which Mount Carmel is built.

What is Mount Carmel Ministries?

Mount Carmel Ministries is a year-round retreat and conference center which also offers week-long family and adult camps. It is a non-profit, Christ-centered organization with voting members called Proclaimers and governed by a Board of Trustees.

What is a Proclaimer?

They are friends of the ministry who donate \$250 or more per calendar year. In 2017 there were 387 Proclaimers.

How did Mount Carmel begin?

Mount Carmel was founded in 1938 by the Lutheran Bible Institute (LBI) of Minneapolis as a summer family camp. In 1987 it became an independent non-profit organization.

How is Mount Carmel funded?

Funding comes from:

1. Donations from guests and friends
2. Guest program fees
3. Sales from *Daily Texts*
4. Grants and other sources

What are the *Daily Texts*?

The *Daily Texts* is a devotional book produced annually by Mount Carmel. The texts chosen for each day first began 270 years ago by the Moravians. Mount Carmel's version, which was first printed in 1997, includes, prayers, hymns and Martin Luther's TRIP© method of reflecting on the verses.

Is Mount Carmel affiliated with a church or denomination?

Mount Carmel, founded by Lutheran Bible Institute of Minneapolis, became an independent ministry in 1987. Our pastoral staff are ordained Lutheran, but we serve people from many denominations.

Celebrating Twenty Years of Rug Hooking

For the past 20 years, a group of women who have learned the art of Rug Hooking gather at the end of October for five days to practice their craft.



While the basic concept is similar to what many of us know as latch-hooking, rug hooking is more sophisticated. It starts with a piece of material similar to burlap stretched over a frame. A design is traced on the material and then wool fabric, cut in strips, is pulled with a hook through the material. A variety of colors and designs allow rug hookers to create a unique piece of art. Some are used for practical purposes like mug rugs and pot holders. Others are framed and hung on the wall.

This group of artists came together when a local resident, Jo Hammargren planned a rug hooking event in Alexandria and invited Jan Mostrom to be their teacher. Those who attended enjoyed it so much they decided to plan a several day yearly retreat called Up to the Lake Rug Camp.

When the planning group toured Mount Carmel the lodge was brand new and the sleeping wing wasn't quite finished but they immediately knew this was the place. The dining area provided ample room and the large tables allowed them to spread out their fabric. The cozy fireplace and view of the lake along with the hospitality of Jill Manlove and the Mount Carmel staff made it the ideal retreat setting.

Through word of mouth the event grew in popularity and soon there were people coming from all over the region, and even one from Washington state. Over the years these women formed quite a bond. They have weathered blizzards and celebrated late Indian summers with picnics at the beach. They have mourned the death of charter members and joyfully welcomed others new to rug hooking. They have walked with each other through the ups and downs of life between retreats and enjoyed catching up when together at Mount Carmel.

After 20 years these rug-hookers have become members of the Mount Carmel family and we are honored to host them. This year we celebrate the community they have formed and the beautiful art they create.



Expanded Family Camp Options

To accommodate the busy schedules and financial needs of today's family, we have expanded 2019 family camps to include a couple of shorter options. You can now choose from two 3-night camps and two 5-night camps. For those of you who still love coming for a full week, we still have three 6-night camps.

THREE NIGHT CAMPS:

June 20-23 | *Overcome!*

Jesus has overcome the world. Even when we have not. Especially when we have not! Come explore how the Holy Spirit helps us in times of Fear, Anger, Anxiety and Depression. Guest teacher Steve Thomason, a visual artist specializing in drawing, animation, and humorous illustration, will bring the Gospel to life in ways that will surprise and inspire you.

June 27-30 | *Keeping Youth in the Faith*

Teacher Kyle Fever loves creating community through study of of Scripture. During this mini-week Kyle will help us explore new ways God is at work in the world, especially with and through the next generation.

FIVE NIGHT CAMPS:

June 30-July 5 | *Seasoning Our Corner of the World*

Using stories and humor teacher Bill Yonker will help us think about ways we can be salt in the world and share our faith convictions in relevant ways. Bill is a nationally known speaker and the Senior Pastor at Immanuel Lutheran Church in East Dundee, Illinois. We will also be blessed to be led in worship by musician Lynn Stoneking.

July 7-12 | *Building Biblical Friendships*

How do we cultivate healthy friendships and how do we instill these skills in our children? This week's teachers will lead us in pursuing Holy Friendship from a biblical perspective. Pastor Molly Weinrich and her husband Cory (former missionary), Pastor Angela Way (Community of Grace, White Bear Lake), Amy Lindquist (MA- Cross Cultural Ministry) and Dr. Nate Lindquist (professor of Physics and missionary kid), the teaching team, will also share stories from their own journey as friends.

SIX NIGHT CAMPS:

July 13-19 | *Sounds of the Holy Spirit*

The 1st century church has a lot in common with the 21st century church. Discover in the book of Acts how the Holy Spirit gives us powerful tools to respond and overcome challenges in our day. Guest teacher Randy Freund will be joined by musicians Milt and Andrew Scott.

July 20-26 | *Strengthening Families*

Individuals, couples and families can all grow in their relationships, becoming servant leaders in all realms of their lives. Teacher Sarah Thingvold has a deep passion for supporting families—forming, nurturing and sustaining relationships to last a lifetime.

July 27-August 2 | *Having a HEART for God*

Using the acrostic H.E.A.R.T., pastor Nathan Hoff will help us reflect on the life of David and apply the themes of Hope, Endurance, Affections, Relationships and Thanksgiving to our lives. He and his wife, Joy, along with their four children will serve as our worship leaders. Pastor David Wollan, a gifted speaker will be our evening preacher.

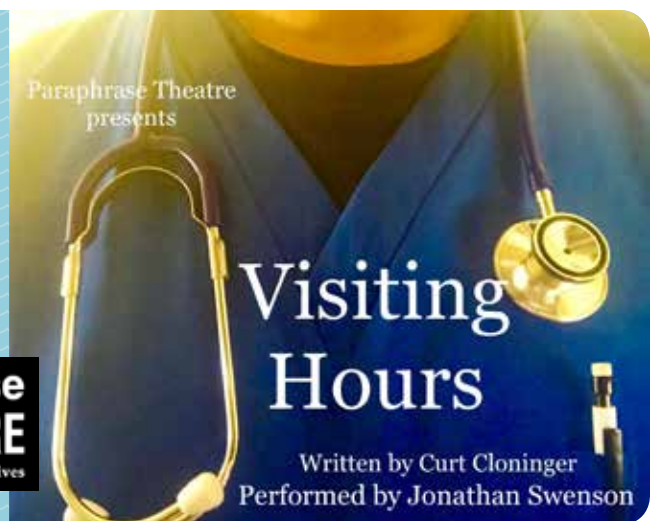
