These lectures examine the historical and theological connections between Judaism, Christianity, and Islam—often collectively referred to as the "Abrahamic faiths." While all three claim a connection to Abraham, their conceptions of God, revelation, and salvation differ in fundamental ways. We will examine both the shared roots and the profound theological divergences that shape each tradition. The goal is to understand not only where these faiths intersect but also why their identities remain distinct from one another. Adam is Director of Academics and Scholar in Residence at 1517. He earned his DPhil from the University of Oxford in 2006 and served as Professor of History, Dean, and Assistant Provost in the Concordia University System for nearly two decades.

# "God's English Accent: How the Bible Came to Your Language Today"

2026 marks the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of the first New Testament into modern English. In 1526, fearing arrest, William Tyndale had fled England, setting in motion events which would have a lasting effect on future generations of English-speaking people around the world. As an outlaw, Tyndale would move from town to town throughout northern Europe, stopping long enough to find a printer who would be willing to print his recently translated version of the New Testament. Over the years, Tyndale's work would morph from one edition to the next, leading us to the Bibles we have today. It could be said he was the one who gave God an English accent and gave the English-speaking people the word of God. This week we will trace the fascinating account of how we came to have the Bible in English. Not only will we be looking at how the Bible came to us in English, we will be looking at the array of English translations available to us today and which one might speak best into your life. We assure you, Paul's teaching sessions will be above average.
